Carl E. Stewart, 89, of New Albany, Ohio passed away December 17, 2020. He was born February 10, 1931 in Cabell County, West Virginia to the late George and Georgia (Jolly) Stewart. Carl was a very talented musician, having taught himself how to play guitar at the age of 15. He was a part of numerous bands that played in bars and clubs in the Columbus area. Carl enlisted in the United States Army at the age of 18. During his time in the service he was a part of building the Panama Canal. When he arrived home he married the love of his life Betty. He then began working as a roofer and a truckdriver. He was also a member of Amvets Post 89. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his wife, Betty; children Rick Stewart, Debbie Wingate and Kevin Stewart; grandson Jason Hodge and siblings, Bud, Lee, Ray, Betty, Dorthy and Jean.
