Dorothy Howland Baker, born September 14, 1908 in Ripley Ohio to the late Anna E. and William E. Howland. She died April 19, 2013 at Friendship Village of Dublin, her residence for the past 32 years. She is preceded in death by her husband William Prescott Baker; brother William Hensey Howland.
