June 1, 1960 - January 15, 2020

Tim McDaniel, age 59, of Westerville Ohio, died on January 15, after a determined fight with ALS, also known as Lou Gehrig's disease. He was born on June 1, 1960, in Wooster Ohio, to Charles and Wilda McDaniel.

He graduated from Wooster High School in 1978 and Bowling Green State University in 1982. Tim was a leader in the Business Valuation field and published two books about Valuations. He was a Partner at Rea and Associates, Inc. In his work life he loved meeting with business owners discussing ways to increase the value of their businesses and transferring it to the next generation. He was particularly well-known for explaining complex business concepts in everyday terms.

Tim loved his family deeply and was loved by them in return. He was so grateful to be in love with his wife, Jenny, who he married in 2018 and for her selfless love and care during his illness. He was intensely proud of his children and loved them so dearly - Andrew, Ellen and Charlie. Tim appreciated what amazing young adults they had become, their spiritual maturity and the friendship they had with each other. He remained close with his mom, siblings, and had many close friends.

Tim accepted Jesus Christ as his personal savior and was active in churches and ministry during his life. He loved to study the truths of his faith and have in-depth conversations about what he was learning with others. He was so grateful that God gave him the gift of life and looked forward to being with Him in eternity.

He loved sports, was a loyal long suffering Cleveland sports fan and will have a special place in Heaven due to this. He enjoyed hiking in nature, long distance biking, tennis and was an all-star baseball player in high school. He also loved getting together with close friends and family to have a drink around his fire pit.

He started to have life changing muscle weakness from ALS in the fall of 2017. Tim dealt with the complications of ALS and met its many challenges with amazing patience,

stubborn determination, and a good sense of humor when he could. Though ALS took many abilities from him, he maintained that it did not take away the things that really mattered to him: the love and closeness he shared with his family and friends and showing love to those around him. Tim did not face this disease alone. Each week he had friends come over that provided hours of support, comfort, and good distraction.

Tim is survived by his wife Jenny, his sons Andrew and Charlie and daughter Ellie (Raff C). Step-Children - Wes and Brittany Ayers, He is also survived by his mother Wilda McDaniel and his sister Lee Zerrer (Wooster) and his brother Phil McDaniel (Rocky River) and many nieces and nephews. His Father, Charles McDaniel passed away previously.
